"Antiques Roadshow" appraiser Kenneth W. Farmer Jr. will host live appraisals Sept. 29.

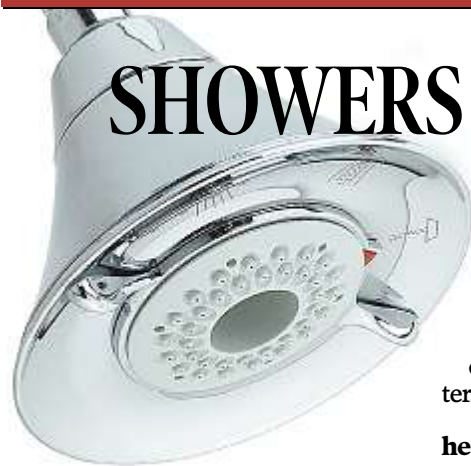
